

French II: Course Information

Welcome back to French Class!

The second semester of French study is a continuation of what you learned in French I. We will focus on using the language orally, in writing, and in reading. Materials: one 3 ring binder with dividers, notebook paper, and something to write with (Kleenex donations are also welcome!)

Grading: Grades are weighted according to the test or assignment, counting once, twice, or three times, depending on the amount of work required. These grades comprise ninety percent of the final grade. You will be told how much work will count when it is assigned. Ten percent of the final grade will be the final exam.

Classroom Rules: All DHS rules will be enforced according to the student handbook including rules on behavior and tardies. Also,

1. Be on time and ready to begin when the bell rings.
2. Be respectful of both teacher and classmates at all times.
3. You are to work on FRENCH ONLY during class. You may work on homework only if permission is granted by the teacher.
4. Have a good attitude at all times!

If you choose to break a class rule:

1st time: warning

2nd time: note home to be signed by parent

3rd time: note home and 15 minutes after school detention

4th time: note home and 30 minutes after school detention

Discipline referrals will be issued at the teacher's discretion

Classroom Procedures:

1. All make up work must be completed within 5 school days after you return to school. It is YOUR responsibility to get your assignments and set up make up times if necessary. If you do not come when we have planned to make up work, you will receive a zero. Failure to make up other work results in a zero on the missed work. Any assignments due on the day you were absent are due the day you return to school unless your parent has notified me otherwise.
2. Stay organized and keep all of your work. It will help you to keep all handouts, etc. organized for future reference.
3. Listen and follow directions! Your success requires active participation.
4. If you need extra help, YOU must ask before it is too late! Don't get behind!

Expectations:

Grade Reports will be sent home every 4-5 weeks. Students are expected to have these reports signed and returned to me the following day. It is each student's responsibility to make sure all work is completed and turned in. Remember that when an assignment is not completed and turned in, it will be recorded as a zero. That can really hurt your grade!

Cheating policy: Students are expected to demonstrate academic integrity with all assignments and assessments. For this reason, students should make a conscious effort to face forward clear everything from desks, and keep eyes on their own work. Any form of cheating will result in a zero and students will not be allowed to retake the assessment. The use of online translation sites while completing assignments outside of the classroom is acceptable only for looking up words or simple expressions (NOT complete sentences) when a French-English dictionary is not available. If, after reading the assignment, it is apparent that a student has relied too heavily on a translation site, 10 points will be deducted from the grade, and the student will be required to redo the assignment in B-210 before school at a time designated by the teacher. Failure to redo the assignment will result in a zero.
