Early Awards Palmetto Fellows Scholarship

In order to be eligible to apply for the Early Awards of the Palmetto Fellows Scholarship high school seniors must meet one of the following criteria:

Score a minimum 1200 on the SAT or 27 on the ACT *by the November test administration* (in order to determine the highest combined score, the score on the SAT must be calculated by using the highest Math score combined with the highest Critical Reading score); earn a cumulative 3.5 GPA on the Uniform Grading Scale at the end of the junior year; and rank in the top six percent at the end of the sophomore or junior year.

OR

Score a minimum 1400 on the SAT or 32 on the ACT *by the November test administration* (in order to determine the highest combined score, the score on the SAT must be calculated by using the highest Math score combined with the highest Critical Reading score) **and** earn a cumulative 4.0 GPA on the Uniform Grading Scale at the end of the junior year.

***NOTE: You can get help with your FAFSA even if you are not going to Converse or SMC. ***

You must bring:

- The Social Security Numbers for the parents or guardians AND the student
- OR your Alien Registration Numbers (if you are not a U.S. citizen)
- Your most recent federal income tax returns, W-2s, and other records of money earned.
- A recent Bank Statement
- Records of untaxed income
