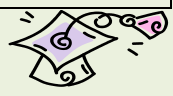

Financial Aid/Admissions representatives will be in the C Wing Career Office from 11:30am – 1:45pm to assist students and parents with the financial aid process. If you need help with your FAFSA make sure you bring a copy of your parents' taxes.

***NOTE: You can get help with your FAFSA even if you are not going to Converse or SMC. ***

You must bring:

- The Social Security Numbers for the parents or guardians AND the student
- OR your Alien Registration Numbers (if you are not a U.S. citizen)
- Your most recent federal income tax returns, W-2s, and other records of money earned.
- A recent Bank Statement
- Records of untaxed income
